Eric Picciano noted that the CSLB has clarified the Scope of C-39 work allowed on reroofing insulation. CSLB now considers such insulation work as "incidental and supplemental" as defined under Title 16, California Code of Regulations § 831, not requiring a separate C-2 Insulation and Acoustical contractor license.

CEC: (Paula David)

The CEC is now a preferred provider for the ICC. New energy software has been approved for the next iteration of the Energy Code.

New Business:

Kevin being a member of the Fire Advisory Committee gave a brief discussion of asphalt kettles and a concern related to the large point load they create when placed on roofs during the roofing process. He also noted that the kettles are not allowed to be within 20' of combustible construction.

Discussed energy storage system such as the Tesla battery which contains an electrolyte that is a flammable liquid.

NFPA is currently testing the Tesla battery as related to hazardous gasses and explosion hazards. NFPA 17 Article 706 is to address storage battery fire safety.

Kevin also noted that the cbpAccess total votes on issues presented were ranging in the 250-500 total vote range and that if California would coordinate their voting bloc, we could make a great impact on the resulting Code
